The Monthly Message from Deacon Jane Rice

Can we imagine a God who sings a happy song over us, a God who dances with shouts of joy? Could our God be the one who laughs and enjoys life? Scripture tells us that God's playground is creation and the people who dwell in it. God enjoys this beauty, sees that it is good, and takes great delight in all that is.

The spirit of God dances among us, and calls us to appreciate and enjoy life. We can find words in scripture that encourage us to 'become like little children. We forget our inner child when we become too preoccupied with adult business and busyness. Sometimes this inner child has been wounded early in life, crushed by adults who abused the spirit or body.

The natural child of our very young days took great delight in life, discovering everything for the first time, being full of awe at the most ordinary things of life. I think sometimes as we grow older this part of ourselves gets lost. Adults begin to tell us how we ought to think and act. We talk about children needing to learn about appropriate boundaries for their behaviour and to develop social skills, too often the joy of life is lost in the process of learning how to grow up. As adults we can often judge according to our own agenda. Children learn to adapt by keeping their mouths shut, by not talking or laughing or asking guestions when it would be natural to do so. They learn to worry about what others think, and to fear failure.

The disciples reflected this adult response to the inner child when they tried to chase away children being brought to Jesus for a blessing. The disciples couldn't be bothered with the children. When Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them 'Let the children come to me; for it is such as these that the kingdom of God belongs'. When we lose sight of our inner child, we lose a beautiful and essential part of ourselves. We become serious and competitive. We focus on obeying and agreeing and being accepted. We get our applause by working hard

or by living up to others expectations. Our culture says 'the more busy we are, the more important we are' work gives life meaning and value. We are praised for how much money we make, and how much we can produce. We are not praised for playing or for simply being. That is not to say that success and accomplishments are not good, but we cannot base our life or our identity on them.

Rediscovering our inner child can have a significant impact on our spiritual life. The inner ability to wonder and to be in awe helps us to become contemplative. Contemplation is the prayer of quiet in which we are at home with God. We do not need words. We simply 'be' in God's presence. Our inner child helps us to enjoy being over doing. A variation on Ps. 46' 'Have leisure and know that I am God'. In our true leisure times we can learn to be more receptive, more open, more peaceful and more ready to recognise the many gifts in our life. Leisure is more than just not doing anything. It is intentionally enjoying life without having to be functional or productive. Dance, plant tomatoes, or watch a sunset ...or even sunrise!! Let us enjoy the playground of God and let us this summer recognise that God takes delight in us and in our world.



R & R Group update.

We have three quotes for the toilet refurbishment and new layout, and the Church council have agreed to award the toilet project to "Melbourne Plumbing", a contract is in the process of being drawn up for the total



cost of £17,000 and the project is to take place late July and run for up to 4 weeks, to coincide with the holidays of our dancers and uniform groups etc.

Also for the main project (Roofing /Foyer and rear Extension), the R & R Group have sent out three sets of Full size drawings to receive tenders, within a months' time. The overall project is looking in the region of £220,000 and leaves us with a shortfall of around £100,000 . we will be asking the denominations (AGAIN) and others for funding, but cannot start that process until we have the tenders returned to us. Meanwhile the Methodist Circuit have offered £20,000 (which was 10% of the previous estimate of £200,000) , but we will ask all three Denominations (AGAIN).

We would ask any of the SMC congregation, to prayerfully consider whether they could make an interest free loan to SMC for up to 5 years, as a potential way to have the project commence, before a delay adds even more cost to the Project. This idea is one way to help make up the shortfall once the final costs are known and all the grants have been obtained. At this stage it is only something to be considering.
