## The Monthly Message from Rev'd Susan McIvor

Dear Friends,

Harvest is a time of abundance and I love it! At this time of year before the fruit falls to the ground the tree branches hang heavy with the brightly coloured treasure. Acorns and conkers burst forth promising new life for the future. The leaves of the trees turn fiery red, gold or bronze and are at their most vibrant before they flutter to earth. The tractors are busy in the fields to the south side of our parish; the grain gathered, the land mowed and prepared for next year's growing season as "all is safely gathered in". Across the country churches are busy with harvest festivals and harvest suppers. Harvest is a time to decorate the church creatively and to celebrate the goodness of God's love as we trust in God for all we need to sustain us in life. 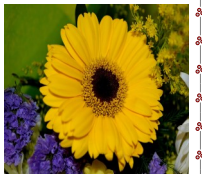

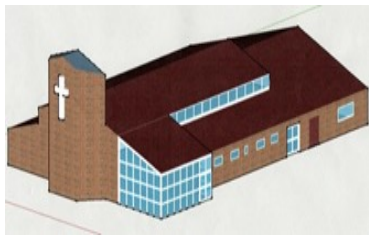

## R & R Group update.

We are now doing a small amount of changes to the new toilets by adding wall mounted soap dispensers to make it tidier. The Gents and Ladies sinks we will be fitting "press" taps (auto shut off) which will minimise usage and reduce waste.



### The Main Building Project:-

We cannot move the potential "grants" from the denominations forward until we have had a meeting with the three denominations, and established some compromise in the wording of the "sharing agreement". Alternatively we need achieve an understanding from the Anglican Diocese, that any Methodist and URC funding is classed as "Loans in perpetuity", i.e. payable back to them should the church ever cease to be a church, at any time in the future (it is an Anglican Diocese own the building).

We are very much aware that there will be a shortfall in the funding so we ask you to prayerfully consider your response and how the shortfall can be met when it is known.

### **Arriva Bus Services in Derby**

David Dockray has compiled some information on the forthcoming changes to Arriva buses in Derby from the 25<sup>th</sup> October, one significant change affect Stenson Fields.

The Alvaston service 44/45 will change to 1/1A.

The Melbourne/Swadlincote service will change to 2/2A/2B.

The Ring Road service 40/40A/41 will change to 4/4A.

The Littleover service 32/33/33A/36/36A will change to 5/5A/6/6A.

The Sinfin/Stenson Fields service 37 will change to 7 and will start and finish in Babington Lane i.e. not use the Bus Station. It will travel via the Spot, Normanton Road, Cavendish, Stenson Road,, Oaklands Avenue, Arleston Lane, Ragley Way, Deepdale Lane and then back to the Babington Lane in the City Centre. On a trial basis this service will also run until 11.00 pm.

The 38 Service is unchanged.
