The Monthly Message by the Bishop of Repton

Bishop Jan recently addressed the new Derby Deanery (of which we are part) and below are the main points of her talk. This is the beginning of a conversation that will go on for the next few months and years. We don't know the answer, but are looking for a way forward for the parishes, deanery and diocese.

The Church of England in 2018 can seem doom and gloom:

- Numbers falling
- Congregations getting older and more tired
- No children or young people
- Big old buildings to maintain
- Not enough money
- No one is interested in coming to church any more
- John Humphrys hates Thought for the Day

If we were Tesco, we'd update our logo and come up with a new mission strategy. But we aren't Tesco, and our mission statement is Matthew 28 v 19-20. The big question we face is this: "Do we believe God?"

- God's people are in exile, but God promises them a future (Jeremiah)
- God will not abandon us

The Church of England suffers from institutional atheism

- We say we believe in God, but act as if we don't
- We act as if we're in charge and it is all down to us \cdot God gets sidelined

There are signs of new life, but they are all fragile, very new and delicate.

Numbers are not falling everywhere:

- Messy Church and Fresh Expressions
- Resource Church proving a source of growth
- Pioneer Ministry
