The Monthly Message by Vincent Martin

Everyone is Invited In

As we enter the season of Advent, it has already been a busy time for Sinfin Moor Church as our Christmas Fair fundraiser on 24th November showed. However the busyness of Christmas can often detract away from the real meaning and leave us tired and exhausted without even having a minute to think about the Nativity message. An important thing for us all to try and remember is to slow down and refresh yourself in the hope and joy of the coming Christ. After all, it is important to be physically as well as spiritually strong, especially in the hectic days of December.

It is interesting that the term "Advent" is derived from the Latin word meaning "coming" and for Christians we anticipate the impending birth of our Lord and Saviour Jesus the Christ child. But it strikes me every year that we see less and less of the nativity within the Christmas paraphernalia that adorns our shops and high streets and it is often left to our churches to carry the torch for the virgin birth. Maybe it is a sign of more secular times in our country or perhaps people anticipate the coming of Santa more so than a religious figure. Whatever the reason, it is imperative that as Christians we recognise and maintain the importance of the nativity. I remember being completely amazed by the symbolism of the gifts of the three kings, for encapsulated in this simple scene are powerful messages about Jesus life. In addition to the honour and status implied by the value of the gifts of the magi, scholars think that these three gifts were chosen for their special spiritual symbolism about Jesus himself—gold representing his kingship, frankincense a symbol of his priestly role, and myrrh a prefiguring of his death and embalming—an interpretation made popular in the well-known Christmas carol "We Three Kings." Powerful messages that can often be missed whilst concentrating on the cute little baby lying in a manger.

The other thing about the nativity is the unlikeliness of some of the characters involved. Born in a barn, in a manger, the Christmas story is

full of unlikely characters: A teenage mother, a fatherless child, shepherds (some of the lowest of society) hearing the call, wise men from afar, a backwater town from nowhere special. Those on the edges are drawn to the heart of the action. Could this be the message to all of us, that everyone is welcome, everyone is invited in? Our Lifewords leaflets available in the foyer explore this in more detail and really do make interesting reading.

We hope you'll join us in finding ways to share that invitation this year to welcome people in to the good news of the Christmas story, whether you come to one of our Christmas services or simply pray for our church and our ongoing pioneering ministry as we try to reach out more to the people of our surrounding areas and beyond. Indeed prayers for a new minister will never go amiss. "Our church and community centre at the centre of the community" message will tell everyone we are there for them and invite everyone in.

So as Christians we look forward to the birth of Jesus with excitement and hearts filled with love, joy and goodwill, something that was shown in abundance and commented on at our Christmas Fair.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support and wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year filled with that very same love, joy and goodwill, from myself and all of my family.

Partnered alongside the usual items of bric a brac, books and our breakfast (and lunch this time) cafe, the church was filled with a sea of gold, silver, green and red, the colours of Christmas and stalls full of gifts galore.

We had Christmas gifts, a prize raffle, cakes, jewellery, guess the name of the teddy, guess the weight of the cake and the biggest tombola we had ever seen (600 prizes!) in the foyer with the rest of the fundraiser in the back bay. Our advertising campaign and strategy was developed quite a while back but began in earnest online on 5^{th} September when the poster was launched alongside a planned series of teasers, ramping up to promotion almost every day in the weeks closest to the date.

We prayed a lot for people to come - the Coffee mornings are well attended but for us to hold something like this is very new and we wanted to reach out to the community and bring many more of them into church.

It wasn't all about selling, the first 100 people through the door received a free goodie bag containing amongst other things three different versions of the Christmas story and a St Johns Gospel, fitting in with our policy of continual outreach. These went almost instantly. We also gave away a lot of other things like sweets and prizes to little children who hadn't necessarily been able to win anything, nobody went away empty handed and everyone was included in the fun.

The Mayor of Derby came along and opened the fair at 9:30 am (I don't think he could believe how much was there), Santa made an appearance and Sinfin Community Choir performed a medley of Christmas songs. Our very own Isobel (my daughter) graced us with a selection of Christmas tunes that she sang on her own and I don't think it was just me that didn't have a dry eye.

I cannot begin to tell you how grateful I am to everyone for their sup-
