## The Monthly Message by Rev'd Eileen Bangay

When Dinnna, who lives not far from me, and comes to our Monday morning sessions, was talking about going to visit her family in Tanzania in January, I, half jokingly said "Can I come too?" "Of course you can" she said and I got home amazed, thinking, what have I myself into this time! But it was brilliant!

Someone said, that as my only experience of Africa was hotel accommodation, I had to accept that I would be in an alien culture! I said, "No, I shall be an alien in someone else's culture" and so it was.

People were so welcoming and hospitable. We stayed with Dinna's brother who is a retired civil servant, so this was no mud hut but a lovely home with a European style lounge - the whole house had a marble floor and the food was lovely. There you were with Spring weather and there was I with temperatures of around 33 degrees in the daytime and 25 at night. Too hot to sit out in so little or no tan for me. We were staying in a suburb of Dar es Salaam, about as far from the city centre as Littleover is from Derby and for the first ten days the only way to see a white face was to look in the mirror. Being immersed in the local and family scene was so good for me. I learned so much.

What I had not been prepared for was the way God was going to use the situation!

Normally, when I go on holiday, I take loads of murder mysteries and the like with me but hadn't room for anything book-wise except my daily prayer book, Bible, Bible Reading Fellowship notes, Guidelines, Bible Study for Today's Ministry and Mission - oh, and a Word Search Puzzle book.

On the journey out, my watch stopped. Then my phone had no signal no matter what anyone did. That meant that the good times of leisure I had were filled with sleep, I needed, and Bible Study using my daily Bible readings.

I had time to read my Guidelines, clear through to Pentecost, with God through that saying things to me I had heard before but not actually lis-(Continued on page 4)

tened to. Some things that had not even occurred to me. Like being asked why I got more excited about holidays than I did about His love and what He is doing in Sinfin, or in my life.

It was excellent and quite chastening. I remember one day thinking daily bread is one thing, I am being given a whole loaf. How blessed was that!

I missed Google more than anything else. I had so many questions and Tanzanians generally only question the price of things, just taking life as it is. That too was good for me to experience. So I just had to listen and learn and try and work out why and how things were as they were. I would not have missed it for the world.

I was really glad to arrive safely back in Derby, but what experiences I had! Thanks Boss. Love you too!.
