#### The Monthly Message by Nathan Sant

It may come as no surprise to you, but we as a country (Zimbabwe) are going through some serious issues at the moment. We are currently having 15 hour power cuts and 3 day (yes that's right 3 day) water cuts which are all down to mismanagement of equipment. We are also having problems with our currency as our government have decided to operate on a single denomination (bond notes) and have outlawed all use of foreign currency. So prices are sky high, for example; Fuel is at \$15 (£1.40) a litre, toilet paper is at \$90 (£8) a pack, 2L of Milk is nearly \$20 (£1.80), tinned goods \$20 (£1.80) each and medicines are very expensive. I could go on and on and on. This is all to do with our government trying to pull us out of a deep hole that was created by nearly 40 years of corruption and greed. I won't lie to you, it is very tough and there are a lot of people who are struggling on a day to day basis if not hour to hour.

By now I guess that you are asking "Nathan why are you starting July's message off in such a miserable tone?" Well it's not for sympathy or pity, We know that as a family we are called to live in Zimbabwe and serve the people here in the way that God has asked us to.

It is however, very interesting in the fact that even though all of this is going on, we are still here. We are still surviving, still living day to day, our girls are going to school and we still have food to eat. This though is all to the glory of God. Admittedly we have had to make a plan in many of the areas of our lives, so that when these trials come, we are ready to face them. When the power goes off we can use our generator, when the water goes off we can use our borehole and if food gets really expensive we have can ask our 'runner' to bring in certain things from South Africa or go ourselves. But God is sustaining us through all of this.

This has got me thinking how when I lived in the UK I took so many things for granted, power, food, water, and even the NHS. I guess the old adage "you don't know what you have got until it has gone" rings very true. But one of the things that has remained constant in my life is Jesus himself. He has never left my side in all of the things that I have done, all of the

places that I have been and all of those "close shaves" that I have gotten myself into. When things have been tough, He has been there and I have been able to lean on Him. In those moments when, like Peter, I was sinking in the waves, I have been able to cry out to Jesus "SAVE ME LORD!" and he has!

I don't know what you are going through at the moment, I don't know what storms in life you are walking through. But I do know that no matter how dark it gets, no matter how bleak the outlook seems, there is hope for you and me. There is one whom you can rely on to get you through it, one who sticks closer than a brother and His name is Jesus. He won't let you down. You are far too precious, you cost Him the ultimate price and He paid that price in full.

There are three scriptures that I want leave you with:

Exodus 14:14 "The Lord will fight for you and you shall hold your peace." - God said this to the Israelites who faced complete annihilation as the Egyptians were chasing them after God had taken them out of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 31:6 "Be strong and of good courage, do not fear or be afraid of them; For the Lord your God, He is the One who goes with you. He will never leave you not forsake you." - God said this to Joshua as he was taking over the mantle left by Moses.

Philippians 4:6&7 "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through our Lord Jesus."

Be encouraged that no matter what you go through, or what happens to you, you can always run to Jesus. He will always fight for you, He will never leave you or forsake you and He will leave you with His peace that will guard your heart and your mind. Because you are precious to Him.
