The Revd Paul Desborough, Assistant Curate of Derby St Alkmund and St Werburgh, Diocese of Derby, has been appointed part-time Priest-in-Charge (to be known as Enabling Minister) of Sinfin Moor LEP and part-time Bishop's Advisor for New Housing, in the same diocese.

It's official! After a long wait, for the SM Church family without a minister and for us as we finished our training with the Anglicans, it has been announced that myself and Jean will be joining you - we just have to wait a bit longer for the actual start date! Please pray for us as we come to a close at our time at St Peters and St Alkmunds, that we will end well and that they will flourish.

We are very excited to be joining you, me as part time 'Enabling Minister', with another part time role as Bishops Advisor for New Housing. The whole role has been designed for the two focuses to be supportive of one another enabling flourishing and fruitful work. Jean, my wife, has recently been licensed as an Anglican Reader and has interests around Spiritual Accompaniment as part of that calling. So together we look forward to moving and connecting with you and those in the Sinfin Moor and Stenson Fields communities.

Our prayer as we come to join with all that's happening with the SMC is for the continuing adventure of our faith together we will enjoy the grace of God and demonstrate His love.

Sharon Sewell, who has been described by friends as "one of the kindest, most vibrant and sociable people you will ever meet", has undergone four heart operations to deal with major complications and life-threatening internal bleeding since January.

But as a result of the aortic dissection, which is a tear in the aortic wall, and all of the surgery Sharon has been through, she will now live her life paralysed from the waist down.


